1. ONLINE DATABASES AT SAUDI ACADEMIC LIBRARIES

ABSTRACT

This chapter reports on the provision of online databases at Saudi Academic Libraries. Over the last two decades many academic libraries in the Arabian Gulf region have introduced electronic resources into their library operations. The degree of their progress in changing from a traditional library environment into an electronic library environment have varied according to their level of education and awareness of the library managers, the direction and support of the mother institutions, and the demands for electronic information sources made by their clientele.

1.1 Introduction

The development of the Internet has transformed the use of information resources and the primary tools for locating information in the libraries. This transformation has provided new tools with greater potentials in helping users to find as much needed information as opposed to library catalogues. The availability of electronic information resources on the Internet, the Web and other forms of electronic storage device are widely viewed as a significant feature in the contemporary educational context and one which offers exciting new opportunities for students and academics (Byerley and Chambers, 2003).
